We also have a new director Steve Constant took over from Herb Sanderson last year. Steve has been busy making sure the program is running awesome. Hi Brian

1). Water Treatment plant completed at a cost of \$7.1M. Biological treatment process. If you want more info on some of the details Bill Marion is the guy. He gave a good interview for the PAGC paper..

2). M&M Slough drainage basically completed last fall, some finishing work and culvert gate yet to be installed. Seemed to work well this spriong, School road was not under water! - \$250K

3). Art's slough drainage project estimated at \$350K has been designed, tendered and waiting for regulatory approval to proceed. Will be done before fall this year.

4). Roads project approved by AANDC to improve the New York, Coxby, School and South Roads. Engineering is being done right now, tendering will be done later this year. Looking for beginning construction in early fall. Value estimated at \$5.0M. This will be a multi year project.

5). Beatty Grid and Carrot River Bridge Project approved by AANDC. Estimated value is \$3.0M. Engineering on the Bridge has been done, tendering and rehabilitation of the bridge should be done this year. The Road project will most likely be delayed till next year.

Brian, I hesitated to put in the values of the yet untendered projects because the costs could be much different. I am okay with M&M and Art's figures going in. Maybe just reference that these projects have been approved and are being worked on will be sufficient. - I'll leave that up to you.
